Belgrave

A special train will depart Belgrave at 1.30pm, following brief speeches on the platform. This train, hauled by 7A will use the same formation as the original re-opening train and 7A will be in 1962 red and black paintwork and will carry a suitable headboard. *Please note that travel on the special train is by prior invitation only*. The Victoria Police Pipe Band will be playing on the platform before and during the ceremonies.

On this special day, the Belgrave workshops will be open for inspection, giving people a rare chance to see the almost completed *Climax* locomotive as well as other PBR locos under repair. It is intended to have 861, one of our "small engines", in steam here also. Well known author Nick Anchen will be signing copies of his new book *The Narrow Gauge* at the



workshops between midday and 1.00pm. Copies are available to members and volunteers on this day only at the special price of \$60. (Normal price \$80).



Menzies Creek


